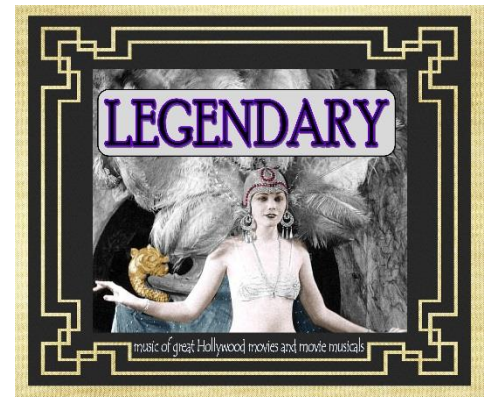

Who We Are

Out Loud Chorus (OLC) is Washtenaw County's Original Mixed LGBTQ+ chorus. OLC provides a safe and welcoming environment for the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, genderqueer, intersex, and asexual community, along with their allies, to come together and share the gift of music. OLC provides continuing musical education and performance experience as well as a social outlet for persons interested in choral music and its production. OLC is fun and flexible, open to many levels of ability, and committed to embodying the diversity of our community. OLC was originally founded in October 1995 by a group of dreamers as a mixed chorus for the LGBTQ+ community of Ann Arbor, Ypsilanti, and surrounding areas. OLC is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization and we are Washtenaw County's only arts organization for the entire LGBTQ+ community.
